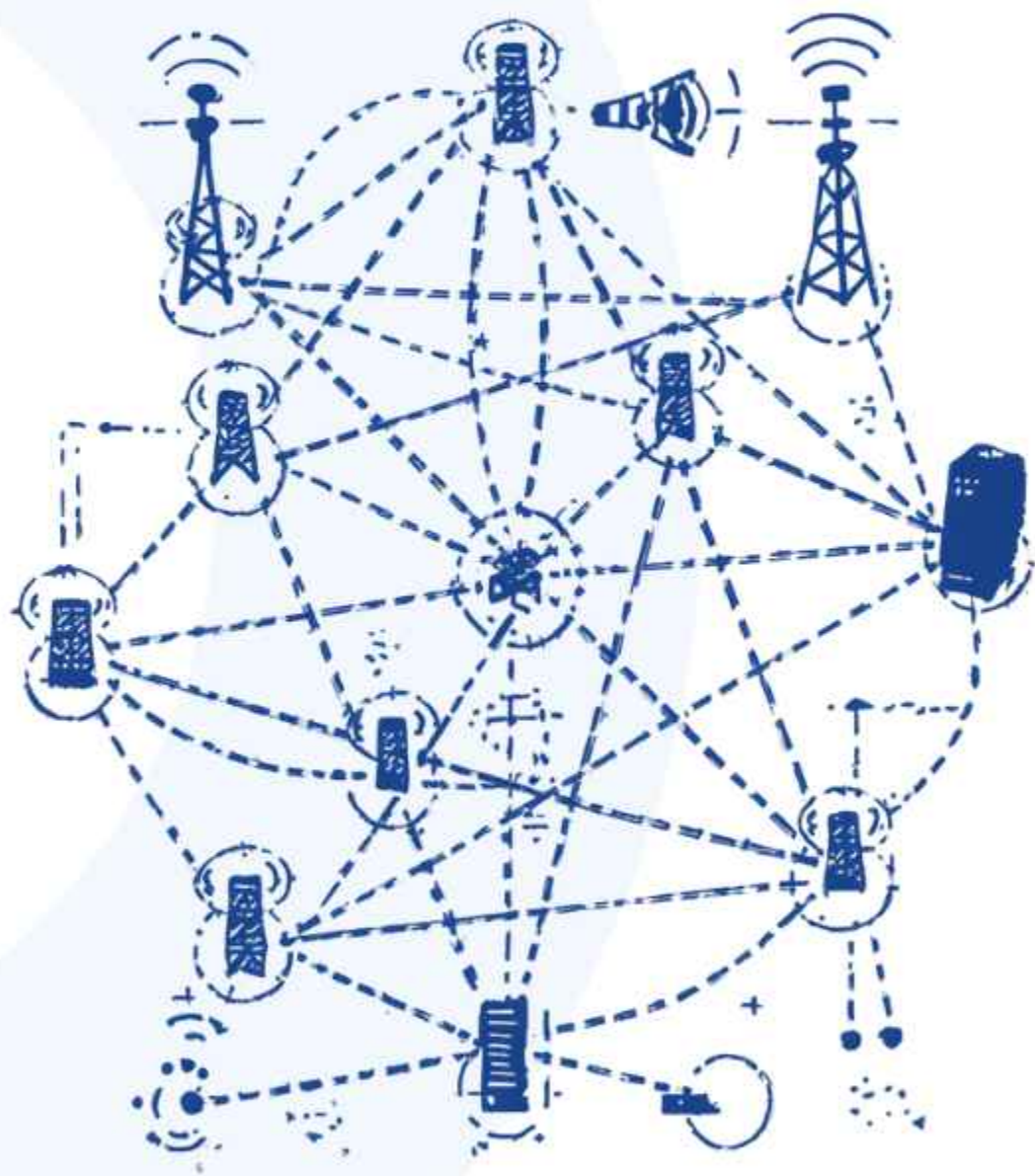

## What is International SMS?

International SMS refers to text messages sent across country borders, connecting people and businesses worldwide. Companies rely on it for marketing campaigns, transactional notifications, two-factor authentication, and critical alerts. Unlike internet-based messaging apps, SMS reaches customers on any mobile device globally — no data connection or smartphone required.





# How International SMS Works

SMS messages travel through mobile operators' networks and international gateways to reach recipients across borders. Routing depends on agreements between operators and SMS aggregators, who manage the connections between different carrier networks.

Key factors affecting delivery include the SMPP protocol for message transmission, routing quality through trusted aggregators, and latency introduced by multi-hop network paths.



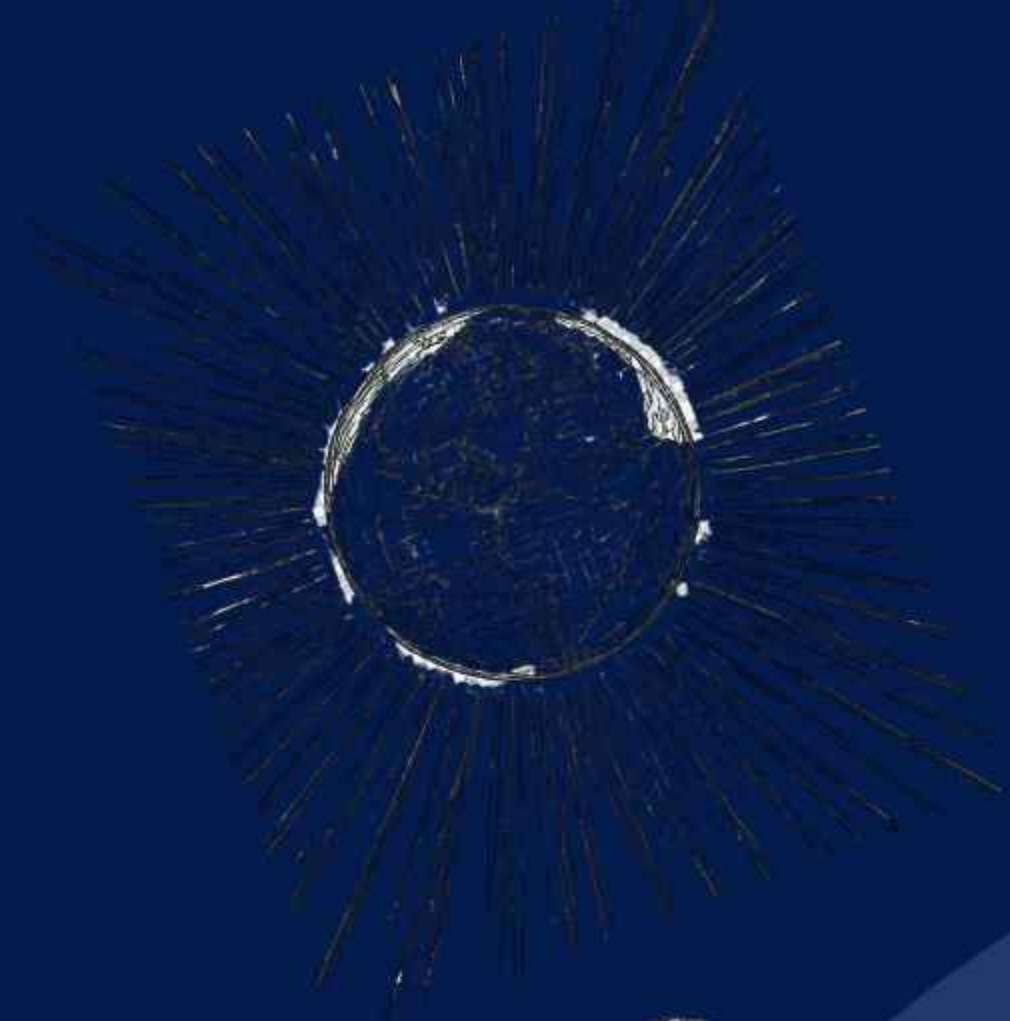
# Key Challenges in International SMS

- Integration with IoT and digital services

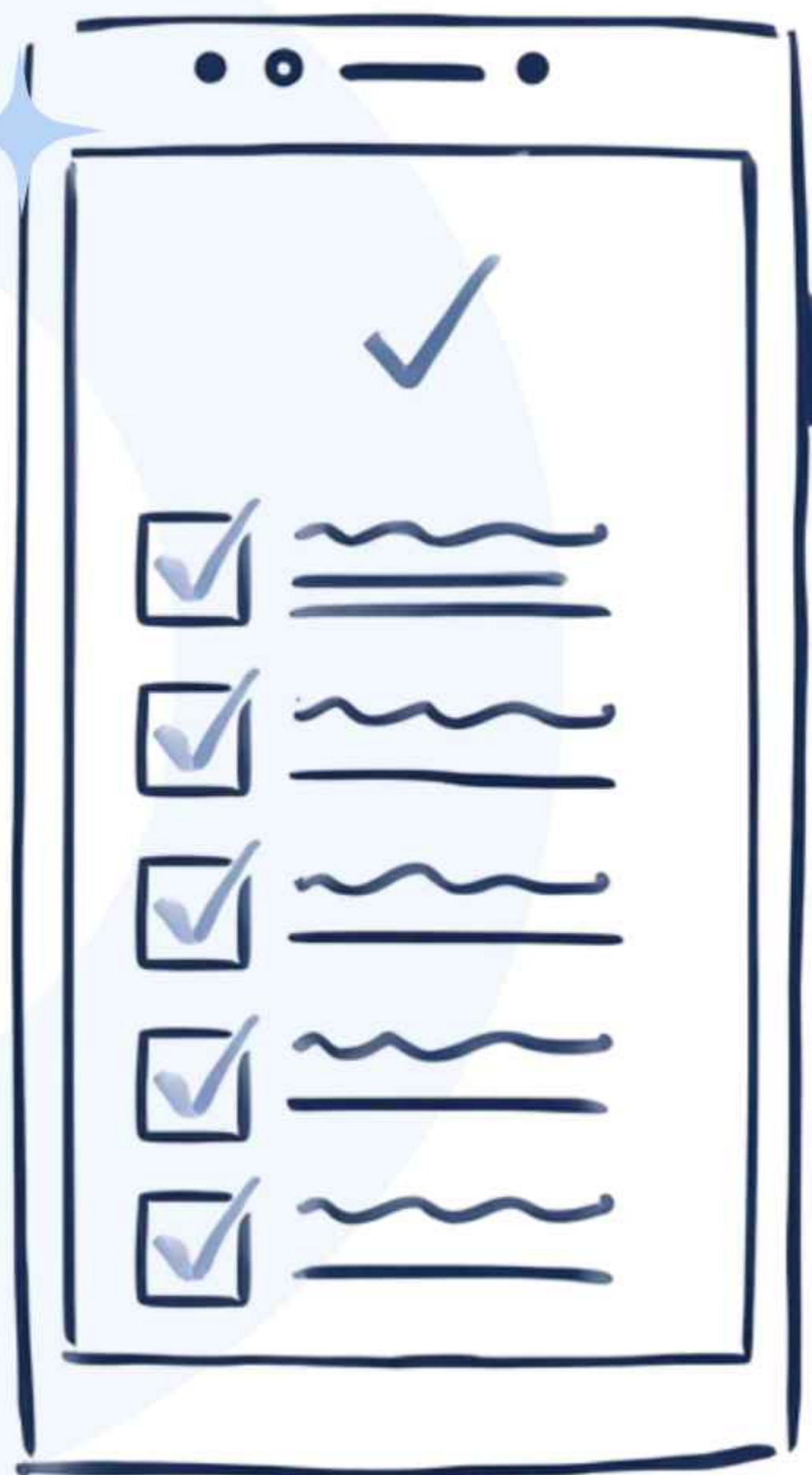


# Regulatory Landscape
